Charades

This amount of prompts is suitable for upto 8 players

Materials:

Printed prompts
scissors
timer
hat/container
score sheet & pen

How to play:

1. Print the prompts
 2. Cut out all prompts and put in a hat or container
 3. Divide guests into 2 or more even teams
 4. 1 team member stays seated while the rest of the team stands to act out the prompts to them
 5. Set a timer for 1 minute
 6. The acting team draws 1 prompt at a time to act out.
 7. The aim is to correctly guess what they are acting and get through as many prompts as possible.
 8. Keep score of how many correct answers each team gets within the minute.
 9. When all the prompts have been used the team with the most points wins.
